POPULAR MECHANICS MAGAZINE PLUGS OUR CLUB

Thanks to Michael Lamm who wrote a two or three page report on the 900 in the January 1980 P.M.-magazine and was kind enough to recommend the "Midwest Saab Club" – at 1916 W. Hood. I assume the 1916 address instead of 1918 was to help us determine which inquiries we received are from Popular Mechanics readers. We received over 40 inquiries from P.M. during the last half of December and the first week of Jan. We answered all mail promptly in the past 5 weeks.

ROAD & TRACK MAG - AIRBAGS....

R&T had another hysterical chapter on the horrible airbag installation which has nothing to do with subscribers of R&T. The airbag rule is for 6 passenger—3 in front-bench seat-pigmobiles only. Sports driver-readers of R&T are not pigmobile buffs. The airbags are for dummies who won't wear shoulder/seat belts and are of no concern of sport car/compact car owners. DIFFERENT TYPES OF OIL FILTERS

Instead of the Saab oil filter I use either A.C. P.F. 20 or Fram PHF 43. I drive a 1977 99GL with a standard 1985 cc fuel injected engine. They are a lot cheaper and work as well as the original Saab filters. I don't suggest using a cheaper filter since some of them have leaked. Also, I do not notice the oil pressure light being on when starting cold. Benny Lum, Battle Creek, Micheles and Saab filters.

CLEAN HEADLINERS

A tip for cleaning 99 headliners - Mine was covered with dirt and pipe tobacco stains. Use Woolite Upholstery Cleaner with a soft brush. Blot out the first application when wet to remove the dirt. Then apply again blotting with a clean white T-shirt. Looks like new with no staining.

THROTTLE ICING -MARGRIT SAYS IT BETTER

Until the throttle housing icing condition can be taken care of by your dealer, Saab urges taking the following precautions when driving in an area where extreme wir ter conditions prevail:

- 1. Press the accelerator pedal once prior to starting to be sure throttle operates freely.
- 2. Avoid driving with a constant level of pressure on the accelerator pedal, particularly at highway speeds during the first half hour after cold start, especially if the car has recently been operated only on short trips.
- 3. Frequently check for ice build-up in the throttle housing during driving by releasing the accelerator pedal and noting whether or not the vehicle begins to decelerate normally. If the vehicle does not decelerate as expected as a result of the build-up, quick and repeated stabs on the accelerator pedal may temporarily dislodge the ice.
- 4. As an added precaution allow for the possibility that the distance required to slow or stop the vehicle may be greater than normal should ice become difficult to dislodge readily. If control of the vehicle is so impaired, vehicle crash can occur.

SCJ

Saab-Scania has found that, despite various improvements made during an earlier recall of 1975-76 models and introduced on vehicles built from 1976 onwards, there still exists the possibility that under extreme winter conditions ice can form in the throttle housing and temporarily impede full closure of the throttle plate when the accelerator pedal is released. This is more likely to happen during highway driving if the vehicle has previously been used on several short stopand-gp type trips that did not allow the engine to fully warm up. To eliminate this possibility improved intake air preheating is necessary. (Also, see MARGRIT ADLER-PAGE 3.)

Vehicles Affected by this Recall: All 1975-79 99 models except 99 Turbo All 1979 900 models except 900 Turbo

MODIFICATION PARTS

Three kits are available to improve intake air pre heating: P/N 9332248-Throttle body water jacket/CVS insulation kit, for all 99*

P/N 9332867-Air preheater improvements/CVS insulation kit, for Federal 900 Two-branch exhaust manifold. P/N 9332859 -Air preheater improvement/CVS insulation kit, for Lambda 900 Single branch manifold (catalyst-·equipped).

* 1975-76 99's with Recall M-02 fix need not have original modification undone. For simplicity kit 9332248 is specified for all 99 variants including 78-79 models with O.E. air preheater.

INSPECTION/REPAIR

99's: Install the throttle body water jacket kit (use free hole punch tool, supplied to make clean holes in air bellows) and CVS hose insulation according to the instruction sheet attached to this S.I. Carefully ensure that there are no coolant leaks.

900's: Replace the intake air preheater parts with the improved ones in the kits and add CVS insulation per the attached instruction.

RECALL CLAIM FORM PROCEDURE

NOTE: Owners notified by Saab-Scania of America Inc. in November, 1979, receive with their notification letter a preprinted M-45 claim form to be used by you. Your dealership will receive the same notice/ claim form mailer for each car in your new car inventory and affected cars to be delivered by Saab-Scania of America, Inc. from its depot locations. This form MUST be submitted by the dealer to the Warranty Dept. This is necessary to complete our recall records and update our periodic recall reports to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). Records are subject to Federal (NHTSA) audit.


Submission of Recall Claims: The recall claim consists of a Factory copy, a Parts copy, and a dealer copy. Forward only the Factory copy to Saab-Scania of America, Inc., Orange, Connecticut, to the attention of the Warranty Department.

Throttle Housing Water Preheater Kit (P/N9332248) For 1975-79 Saab 99 (Except Turbo)

KIT CONTENTS


9332255 (1) Water Jacket Preheater, 9332321 (2) Connector Pipe, 8459505 (2) Rubber Sealing Ring, 7970056 (4) Hose Clamps, 9332297 (1) Hose, 7970064 (2) Hose Clamps, 9332305 (1) Hose, 9332313 (1) Hose 79 71864 (1) Strap, 93 29475 (1) Insulating Hose

- 1. Drain Cooling System.
- 2. Remove air bellows from throttle housing and air flow sensor.
- 3. Check throttle shaft, plate, and springs for binding. Correct, if necessary. (See S.I. 05/79-364, Section 2 Page 92.) Clean throttle housing with a suitable solvent (one that leaves no film or residue such as carbureator cleaner or Loctite Kleen 'N Prime) to the depth that the preheater will enter. Also clean the preheater housing.



- 4. Place the water jacket preheater in the throttle housing and align the openings with the CVS and auxiliary air nipples. Use a PLASTIC MALLET and tap the preheater firmly into the throttle housing.
- 5. Flow Loctite 290 (Wick 'N Lock) around the joint. (Wick 'N Lock will function exactly the same as sweat soldering of a copper water pipe.) NOTE: Allow Wick 'N Lock to set up while performing the following steps and before reinstalling the air bellows.
- 6. Disconnect the forked water hose at the water pump and the upper heater connection.
- 7. Connect the shorter 8mm I.D. hose (485mm long) supplied in the kit to the water pump connection of the forked hose. Use one stepped connector and one large and one small clamp from the kit. Install clamps so that the worm screw locks point down. Lead the newly connected hose under the inlet manifold to the throttle housing heater. (Do not connect at this time.)
- 8. Reassemble the forked hose to the upper connection of the car heater.
- 9. Assemble the long water hose (720mm) from the kit to the short thicker hose (also provided in kit) using the remaining step connector and two clamps.
- 10. Attach the assembled hose to the water pump cover connection. Route the free end of the hose over the inlet manifold and down through the center opening in the manifold runners, under the front runners, and forward to the throttle housing heater. (Do not connect to heater at this time.)
- 11. Mark the locations on the air bellows and use a 5/16" punch to punch out the holes. (See sketch provided for proper locations of holes.)





12. Install the air bellows. (NOTE: Use of silicone spray inside the bellows and the holes for the preheater connections will ease the mounting process.) Be careful not to loosen the preheater when installing the bellows.

- 13. Place the two rubber o-rings from the kit on the water nipples of the preheater and press them against the air bellows.
- 14. Attach the water hoses to the nipples. (Use the remaining two clamps from the kit.) Press the hoses tight to the o-rings (squeezing them against the bellows) and tighten clamps.
- 15. Use the Nylock tie provided to secure the two water hoses and the CVS and air bypass hoses into a neat package alongside the throttle housing. Be sure the water hoses are not kinked at any point.
- 16. On 1976 and later cars thread the thick insulating hose from the kit over the small CVS hose as shown in the sketch. Gently tie each end of this hose snug to prevent entry of outside air. (A Nylock tie strap works well for this purpose.) On early cars equipped only with a large diameter CVS hose, slit the insulating hose, install and tape it in place.
- 17. Replace coolant, run engine until warm, and top up cooling system as extra coolant is required. Check that system is leak free.

- A. P/N 9332867, FEDERAL 900 (Two-branch exhaust manifold)
 - 1. Remove the two front bolts of the manifold preheater stove and install the baffle, provided in the kit, at the bottom front of the manifold.
 - 2. Replace the thermostatically controlled air intake valve (on the air cleaner) with the one provided in the kit.
 - 3. Replace the preheater hose with the insulated hose from the kit.
 - 4. Replace the CVS hose nipple in the intake manifold with the one provided in the kit.
 - 5. Place the insulating hose over the CVS hose, gently tie the end closed over the CVS hose and reinstall the now insulated CVS hose assembly.
 - B. P/N 9332859, LAMBDA 900 (Single-branch manifold)
 - 1. Replace the existing preheater stove with the modified type from the kit.
 - 2. Replace the thermostatically controlled air intake valve (on the air cleaner) with the one provided in the
 - 3. Replace the preheater hose with the insulated hose from the kit.
 - 4. Replace the CVS hose nipple in the intake manifold with the one provided in the kit.
 - 5. Place the insulating hose over the CVS hose, gently tie the end closed over the CVS hose, and reinstall the now insulated CVS hose assembly.

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE NEW SAAB OWNER

The Saab 99 is not the best car on the market, the "best" car would cost about \$90,000 or rather you would have to purchase a package of 3 or 4 vehicles to possess something that answered to all criteria: the most economically operating car, the most durable, the most maneuverable, the fastest, the safest, and the lowest priced...

It is impossible to build such a car yet among the 5,000 letters that we have received from our members, we have encountered a few that expected these six (and more)

features in the Saab.

The Saab is a production car-and all production cars must compete with Detroit-who produces cars at the rate of one-a-minute (using several production lines and teams).

At the Rolls-Royce plant, one man works two days on one door. Their prices in early 1976 was between \$30,000 to \$90,000.

Our point is-if you want a perfect Saab with no defects you'll have to pay twice \$11,000. Furthermore, all talk about the dealer's responsibility to correct defects upon delivery is nonsense. Very few dealers do the work on the carthe mechanic back in the shop is assigned the job. Very few dealers and their mechanics have an engineering degree, and all talk about what the dealer should do is pure drivel.

You can shout and scream, and Congress can pass laws, but, we won't make great engineers out of dealers. If a dealer and his mechanic does innovate a solution to a mechanical defect they should charge a lot more than \$20. per hour. Defects are not the fault of the dealer's mechanic, he did not make the car, he did not sell the car, nor make any commissions on it.

So, that is why we urge you to inspect the car yourself.

Don't waste time inspecting the painted surface & condition of the upholstery. Haggling over trivial scratches takes away work on the important mechanical things.

Test for loose bolts at manifold to muffler connection. Motor - mounts. Look to see if the water drain tubes are clear, & the rubber plugs are in place, or removed. Check if Air/cond' pump pulleys are square-inline, & the tubes are tight.

Tip the mechanic, ask him to take his time on your car.

This writer does not believe in "warrantees", Only a skilled mechanic can fix a problem - not that piece of paper or a white collar Co. rep' or the executive deal-dealer. NEVER write me about the warrantee, { Dick Grossman }.



REAR WHEEL BEARING LUBRICATION 1979 99 & 900

There is a possibility that rear axle wheel bearings on 1979 99 vehicles with VIN 99792000001-99792006401 and 99793000001-99793009500 and 1979 900 vehicles with VIN 90791000001-90791032594 and 90792000001-90792003205 have not been lubed with the specified amount of grease. The rear wheel bearings on vehicles having the above VIN's should therefore be relubricated to avoid the possibility of reduced inner bearing life. NOTE: Affected cars delivered from Saab inventory after mid-November, 1979 probably have already been rectified and, if so, have green paint on the bearing cover.

The following procedure will ensure that a proper amount of grease is present:

- 1. Jack up the rear of the car.
- 2. Remove the hub cap (steel wheel) or aluminum wheel, the bearing cover, hub nut, washer, and outer bearing. (Leave the outer race in the hub.) NOTE: If cover has green paint on it, it does not need lubrication. Proceed no further.
- 3. Install lubrication adaptor, P/N 89 96 431. Align the adaptor's outlet pipe with one of the two recesses in the hub.



4. Pump grease through the adaptor until it flows from the outlet pipe.

<u>CAUTION</u> - Use extra care when using a high pressure grease gun. Too much pressure can force the inner grease seal out of the hub.

- 5. Remove the adaptor and excess grease from the outer end of the hub.
- 6. Reinstall the outer bearing, washer, and a new lock nut, P/N 89 34 697. Carefully torque the lock nut according to the following precedure:
- a. Tighten the lock nut to a torque of 36 ft. lbs. (49Nm /5 kpm) while rotating the wheel. (This will seat the bearing.)

- b. Loosen the nut relieving all tension (do not allow wheel to rotate).
- c. Retorque to 1.4-2.9 ft. lbs. (17-35 inch lbs, 2-4 Nm/O.2-0.4 kpm) with wheel rotating, and secure nut by staking the flange into the locking groove of the axle stub.

NOTE: Use of a round point punch will prevent fracturing the flange while staking. If absolutely necessary, a lock nut may be reused one time but only if it is not reused on the same axle (i.e., so that it will be staked in a different place), is in good condition after unstaking and has had its threads chased by a tap so that correct torque readings are obtained.

- 7. Install the bearing cover in the hub. Paint bearing cover with green paint to indicate the lube was done.
 8. Reinstall hub cap or wheel.
- NOTE: Special tool 8996431 is being supplied to all

dealers concurrent with issuance of this Service Info.


WATER COOLED OIL COOLER - 1980 900

A new shorter oil line from the transmission to the oil cooler was introduced beginning with VIN 90801003275 and 90802000943. If improperly installed, this hose can develop a kink reducing oil circulation.

Examine the hoses on all cars between VIN's 9080100-3275 to 8658 and 90802000943 to 2675. If a kink exists or there is indication that one could form, alter the hose connections as follows:

- 1. Rotate the connector on the oil cooler 20 degrees toward the engine.
- 2. Rotate the connector on the gearbox so that it points straight forward (horizontal).

This is to be checked as part of the PDI. See special message printed on SSDR form of affected vehicles.

SONETT TIPS

When I disassembled the wiper motor I noticed that the brushes were installed wrong, (rotated 90 degrees in their sockets) so that the seating surface was perpendicular to the commutator. The braided leads were too short to rotate them so I wrapped sandpaper around the commutator to make a new seating and reassembled with silicone rubber.

I had problems with gas fumes with over 1/2 tank. One of our members suggested resealing the sending unit. Mine was leaking but didn't solve the problem. I removed the hold down straps and found the vent hose was

so close to the frame over the tank it was deforming the hose and after 130K miles had worn through.

Usually when a person works on his own cars its just for 'love of tinkering' and not just to save money. So I couldn't help figure how much per hour I saved by putting a new front bushing in the starter instead of buy ing another. A free electrical check at Sears revealed a 200 amp. drain while cranking. I used a standard drill size on a piece of copper and soldered it into the end cap. The fit is just a bit loose, but bushings are very forgiving on fit.


You don't need to buy a new speedometer cable housing unless its kinked real bad. I fixed a slight kink with two layers of electrical heat shrink tubing and a new cable from a Universal repair kit at the discount auto store. Cost me \$2.

Pay particular attention to the spark plug behind the alternator. If the wiring harness or spark plug is old it will arc-over. Check it at night or slip a piece of paper between them and check for burns.
